

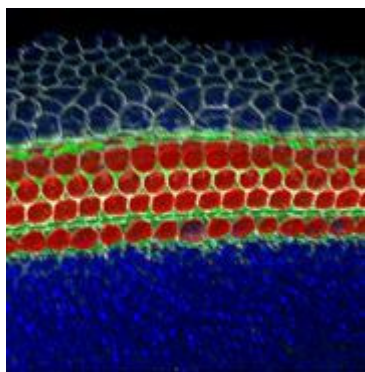

2018-2019 Hearing Restoration Project (HRP) Studies Approved



HHF is grateful to those who give to the [HRP consortium](#). Thanks to our supporters' generosity, the HRP will move forward with several exciting projects in 2018-2019, including: observations of supporting inner ear cells from newborn mice, which have a latent capacity for some regenerative responses; predictions about genes that could influence hair cell restoration in chick and zebrafish models; and identification of changes in gene expression after hair cell loss in the chicken cochlea and vestibular system for cross-species comparison. More details about these promising investigations will appear in the Summer 2018 issue of *Hearing Health* magazine.

HHF Council of Scientific Trustees (CST) Member Peter Steyger Produces New Ototoxic Drug Research

CST member Peter Steyger, Ph.D., professor of otolaryngology/head and neck surgery in the OHSU School of Medicine, and colleagues produced a [Frontiers in Cellular Neuroscience publication on the topic of ototoxicity](#). Steyger, who lost hearing as a child after being treated with antibiotics for meningitis when 14 months old, along with four other leading hearing experts, hopes to advance knowledge of both preventing and treating drug-induced hearing loss.



Emerging Research Grants Recipient Wafaa Kaf, Ph.D., Aims to Improve Meniere's Disease Diagnostic Testing

2015 ERG recipient Wafaa Kaf, Ph.D., seeks to improve the sensitivity of electrocochleography (ECoChG), an assessment of the auditory system, to produce [better testing](#)



[outcomes for Ménière's disease](#). Only 69% of those with the inner ear and balance disorder are correctly diagnosed using ECochG, while 31% of those with Ménière's disease have normal ECochG results. Kaf and team have already made advancements by altering the parameters of the acoustic stimulus on ECochG, an important step for early diagnosis.

HHF Welcomes Retired U.S. Army Colonel John Dillard, U.S.A. to Board of Directors

In February our Board grew to include [John Dillard](#), Senior Lecturer for Systems Acquisition Management at the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) in Monterey, California.
